#### **Principal Whitemarsh's Message**

A few final highlights of the wonderful things that are happening at WHS: 1) our cheer squad, band, and JROTC performed in the annual Daffodil Parade. As has been the case for the past several years, there was not another school like us who was represented so strongly at the parade; 2) our powder puff football team, under the direction of coaches Kelly Miles and Jacob Robinson, took home the Princess Bowl trophy, defeating Franklin Pierce High School 21-0 (our fourth victory in a row); and 3) two of our math team members, Elijah Paez (11<sup>th</sup>) and Gairet Nason (9<sup>th</sup>) represented our school at the state math competition, both placing in the top 3 in separate categories!
